



Peter Gordy II Estate – Binding Administrators

On the 14th day of March 1788 Eleanor Gordy, William Gordy, John Parker, and Samuel Hern are bound to the State of Maryland for two thousand pounds as administrators for the estate of Peter Gordy II. The document lists the responsibilities of the estate administrator and the legal requirements to protect the minors (Peter and Hettie Gordy) who are involved in the estate. Eleanor Gordy and William Gordy are granted letters of administration.

Know all men by these presents that we Eleazer Gordy, William Gordy, John Parker & Samuel Horn of Worcester County and State a^s. are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the full and just sum of Two thousand pounds current money of the State a^s to be paid to the said State of Maryland or assigns to which payment well and truly to be made and done we bind ourselves and every of us our and every of our heirs Executors and administrators

and dated this 14th day of March Anno Dom. 1788

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the within bounden Eleanor Gurdy &
William Gurdy administrators and administrator of all and singular the goods Chattels and credits
of Peter Gurdy late of Worcester County deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inven-
tory of all and singular the goods Chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall
come to the hands or possession of the said Eleanor & William or into the hands and possession
of any other person or persons for them and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited
into the Registry of the Orphans Court of Worcester at or before the 11th day of June next and
the same goods Chattels and credits and all other the goods Chattels and credits of the said
deceased at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession
of the said Eleanor & William or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons
for them do well and truly administer according to Law vizt. shall pay the debts of the said
deceased so far forth as his personal Estate shall extend and the Law will charge as also all such
reasonable Charges and fees as have arisen or shall arise or become due to any the State Officers
from the said Eleanor & William on account of the said deceased or his Estate and further do
make or cause to be made a true and just Account of said administration at or before the 11th
day of March next and all the rest and residue of the said goods Chattels and credits which
shall be found remaining upon the said administrators Account the same being first
examined and ~~approved~~ allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said
Court shall deliver and pay unto the person or persons appointed by Law to receive the
same and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the
said deceased and the Executor or Executors thereof named do exhibit the same into the said
Court making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the said Eleanor
& William within the time being therein required do render and deliver the said Let-
ters of Administration (approbation of the said Testament being first had and made)
in the said Court then this obligation to be void and of none effect or else to remain in
full force and virtue
